PIANO - RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Please read the General Rules and Regulations as well.

- 2. a) To qualify for recommendation to Junior-A Class at the Provincials, the competitors must have performed in three (3) or more solo classes at level 6-9.
 - b) To qualify for recommendation to Junior-B Class at the Provincials, the competitors must have performed in three (3) or more solo classes at level 10 or higher.
 - c) To qualify for recommendation to Intermediate or Senior Class at the Provincials, the competitors must have performed in three (3) or more solo classes at ARCT level or higher.
 - d) To qualify for recommendation to Provincial Excellence Class, the competitors must have performed in three (3) or more classes including the ARCT Concert Group Class and/or Senior Advanced Repertoire Class.
- 3. All competitors must perform in **three** or more classes to qualify for any trophy and scholarship. (e.g., Best Performer in Romantic Pianoforte)
- 4. Each competitor must **submit an original copy/score of the music selections** to the Adjudicator's Assistant prior to the class in which he/she is to perform. Failure to produce an original score will result in Competitors receiving an adjudication only and will not receive a placement NOR mark.
- 5. Competitors must number the first bar of each line in their score (s).
- 6. All copyrights regarding music must be observed. **Photocopies or manual copies of copyrighted material will not be accepted.** Failure to do so will result in disqualification of the competitor. However, music downloaded from the free website www. Imslp.org is permitted. The full URL of the work being performed must be written on the first page of all parts and copies being used.
- 7. First Place Winners of classes from previous festivals are not eligible to compete again in the particular class in which they have **already placed first**. These winners must move up to the next age group or grade level in order to compete in the same classification.
- 8. ENTRY FORMS: All solo entries MUST be submitted on the **Piano Solo Entry Form ONLINE** only.
 - a) Competitor must perform the same selection as shown on the program. Failure to do so will result in disqualification.

- b) Competitors who perform a selection of a grade level that is inappropriate for the graded class that they have entered will receive adjudication only.
- c) Memory is mandatory in all classes. Failure to do so will result in a deduction of five (5) marks.
- d) The adjudicator may stop any performance at any time, verbally or by ringing a bell.
- e) When the performance <u>exceeds</u> the time limit set out in the official Syllabus, the performance may be stopped at the adjudicator's discretion and a deduction of five (5) marks will be made.
- 9. The repertoire for all graded classes must be selected from the 2015 or 2022 piano syllabi or the current Conservatory Canada syllabus. Where grade levels of repertoire differ by conservatory, the current RCM syllabus will apply.
